<u>Lviv Urban Forum</u> is an event focused on sharing best practices in urban planning for the qualitative restoration and development of Ukrainian communities. The second <u>Lviv Urban Forum</u>: Being Responsible will take place on <u>June 27-29</u>, 2024 in Lviv and will be devoted to responsibility for the development and restoration of Ukrainian cities.

The contest is open to local activists who care about historical heritage, spatial development, accessibility, and other important urban issues, as well as architects and urbanists who implement non-profit projects for communities, managers of condominium associations, or members of other urban organizations or initiatives.

The participants and selected scholarship recipients will be able to attend more than 30 inspiring lectures and presentations delivered by Ukrainian and international architects and urbanists. In

particular, there will be presentations by **Alejandro Aravena**, a Chilean architect and Pritzker Prize winner, **Christoph Gantenbein**, an architect who implements global projects while cherishing local values, and **Joanna Averley**, a planner for the British government, who will talk about the implementation of principles and standards in planning and architecture, **Gilma Gylyte**, a Lithuanian architectural reformer of Soviet-era educational spaces, **Markus Zilker**, an Austrian architect who creates objects with inherent care for human relations and community building, and others.

The event will also offer practical workshops on creating public spaces and humane urban planning, along with more than 10 urban field trips to modern urban facilities and spaces in Lviv – from creative and artistic centers to infrastructure and social initiatives that have become successful examples of spatial solutions and public areas.

The event is organized by the Department of Architecture and Urban Development of the Lviv City Council and the <u>Cities4Cities | United4Ukraine initiative</u>.

The prime partner of Lviv Urban is Germany and the German government, in particular the Federal Ministry for Housing, Urban Development and Building, as well as the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development, together with Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH, which are also co-organizers of the Conference on the Reconstruction of Ukraine in Berlin.
